THE GEDLING BOROUGH COUNCIL (CIVIL ENFORCEMENT OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2020

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR MAKING THE ORDER

From October 2020 the Council proposes to introduce a new parking order (the Order) in respect of certain of its Car Parks (Parking Places) which will allow it:

- To add a section of land the Council owns to the Carlton Square Car Park.
 This change is being proposed to add extra land to the Order so that the Council can re configure the Car Park to include the additional land and enforce the existing conditions over the whole of the Car Park.
- 2) To remove a section of Burntstump Lower Car Park from the Order. This change is being proposed to enable the Council to close and dispose of an underutilised section of the Car Park and manage parking in the remaining section of the Car Park by introducing 2

parking in the remaining section of the Car Park by introducing 2 hours maximum stay time to deter long stay parking and ensure parking is available for Burntstump Country Park users.

3) To introduce pay and display parking charges to the Thackeray's Lane Car Park.

This change is being proposed to enable the Council to manage the parking at this Car Park so that parking is available for users of the nearby facilities, to encourage turnover and to discourage long term parking.

- 4) To add a section of land the Council owns to the Park View Car Park.

 This change is being proposed to add the area of land to the Order so that it is subject to the same restrictions as exist for the existing area of the Park View Car Park in order to regularise the informal parking and enable enforcement.
- 5) To add a section of land the Council owns to the High Street Leisure Centre Car Park.

This change is being proposed to add the area of land to the Order so that it is subject to the same restrictions as exist for the existing area of the High Street Car Park in order to regularise the informal parking and enable enforcement.

Once the Gedling Borough Council (Civil Enforcement Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2020 is made the following order will be revoked:

The use of the Car Parks (Parking Places) covered by the Order will be restricted to vehicles of a specified class, parked in such positions, on such days, during such hours, for such periods, displaying such tickets or permits as are advertised at each site. If a vehicle is parked in a Car Park without complying with the requirements of the Order, a contravention shall have occurred and a Penalty Charge shall be payable.
